- *All information received regarding illness or confirmed COVID-19 case is kept confidential within the Oversight Group.*
- *The COVID-19 Oversight Group is in place to ensure the ASC takes every precaution to keep everyone SAFE!*

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS



1. Completion of Skate Ontario COVID-19 Waiver

All individuals taking part in any Aurora Skating Club activities must complete the Skate Ontario Acknowledgment, Release, Indemnity and Assumption of Risk regarding COVID-19 ("COVID-19 Waiver"). Failure to do so means that individual will not participate in the club activities.

Any individual participating in club activities is required to complete a COVID-19 Waiver, or have a signed COVID-19 Waiver on-file with Skate Ontario:

- Skaters
- Coaches
- Board Members
- Staff & Volunteers
- Officials (must be on file with Skate Ontario)

2. Health Screening Form

All individuals participating in Aurora Skating Club programs must submit the Health Screening Form prior to every session. If no form is provided, a verbal screening will be conducted.

3. An Individual becomes unwell with symptoms of COVID-19

➤ **Symptoms include:**

- shortness of breath
- difficulty breathing
- cough
- sore throat
- fever
- headache
- If an individual becomes unwell with symptoms of COVID-19, or if someone is aware of an individual that becomes unwell with symptoms of COVID-19 that individual must immediately stop participation in club/skating school activities.
- A member of the COVID-19 Oversight Group must be informed of the situation and will contact the individual or their parent/guardian to determine if next steps are being taken regarding testing.

4. An Individual becomes unwell with symptoms of COVID-19 DURING SKATING

➤ **Symptoms include:**

- shortness of breath
 - difficulty breathing
 - cough
 - sore throat
 - fever
 - headache
- If an individual becomes unwell with symptoms of COVID-19 while on the ice, they **must immediately stop participation** in club/skating school activities.
 - The individual will be isolated from all others in a well-ventilated area, or outside and provided with a non-medical face mask.
 - The individual shall be sent home and instructed to follow up with their family physician or public health regarding self-isolation and testing
 - The facility will be informed in order to determine if any areas need to be closed off and/or require additional cleaning/disinfecting.
 - A member of the COVID-19 Oversight Group must be informed of the situation and will contact the individual or their parent/guardian to determine if next steps are being taken regarding testing.

5. An Individual is TESTED for COVID-19

- Any individual that is part of the club that has been tested for COVID-19 **must not participate in club or skating school activities while waiting for the results of the test.**
- A member of the COVID-19 Oversight Group will consult with public health to receive direction.

6. An Individual TESTS POSITIVE for COVID-19

- Any individual that tests positive for COVID-19 should inform a member of the ASC COVID-19 Oversight Group
- The COVID-19 Oversight Group will work in collaboration with public health officials as requested.
- Any ASC members who have been in close contact with an individual that tests positive
 1. will not participate in club/skating school activities for 14 days
 2. must follow public health guidelines regarding self-isolation and testing

7. RETURN TO CLUB ACTIVITIES FOLLOWING ILLNESS

- If no test was performed, or the COVID-19 test was negative, the individual may only return to club activities once they are symptoms free for at least 24 hours.

8. RETURN TO CLUB ACTIVITIES FOLLOWING COVID-19

- Following a positive COVID-19 test, an individual must follow all public health guidelines regarding return to activities.

9. MODIFICATION / RESTRICTION / POSTPONING OR CANCELING OF ASC ACTIVITIES

- Based on the evolving COVID-19 pandemic, the ASC is prepared to follow public health, municipal/provincial government and sport recommendations regarding modifying/restricting/postponing or canceling activities.
- The ASC has established a COVID-19 program cancelation – refund policy (see club website under POLICIES).
- ASC members will be notified via email as soon as possible of any modifications / restrictions or cancelations of any programs.
- The ASC will keep any modifications and restrictions in place until advised that it is safe to resume activities by public health, government or sport officials.
